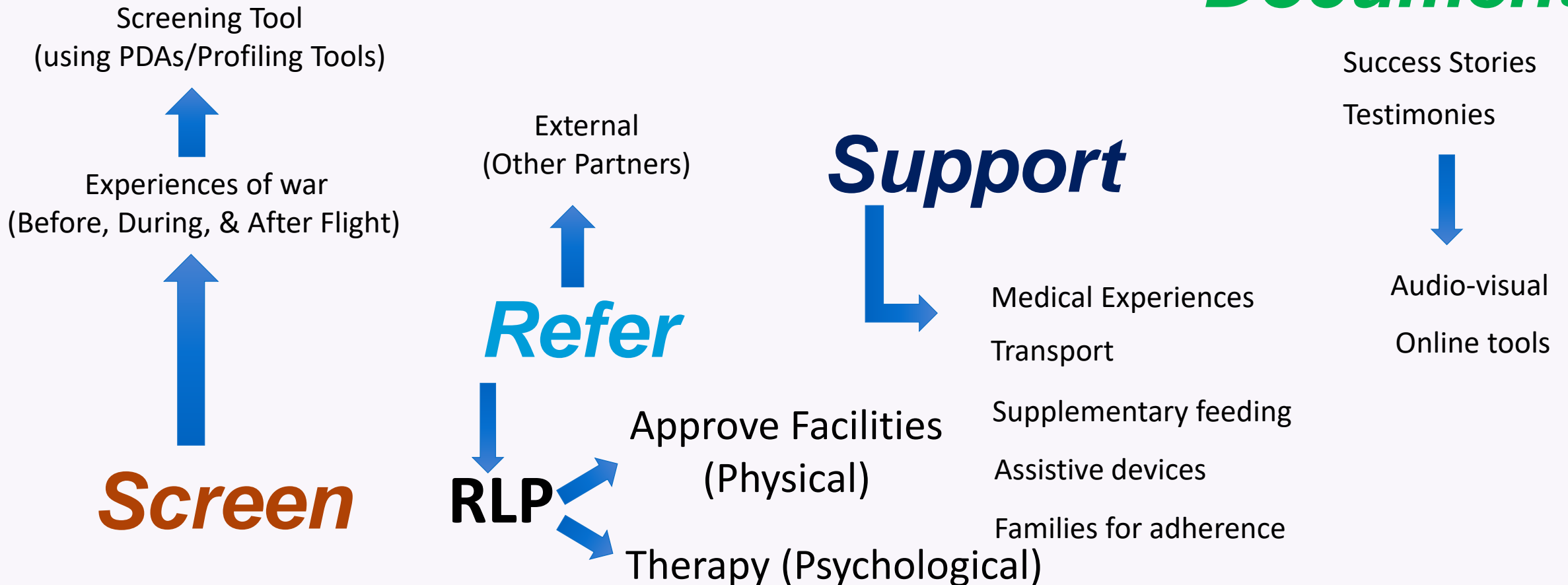

Screened 4,316 (Jan-Dec 17 2018) (1,474 M, 2,822 F, 20 SGNC)

Identified 1,432 survivors of war-related injuries (33 percent) of those screened

Referred 1,054 (78m, 135f) clients Yet to refer 378

Supported 1,054 (78m, 135f) – 74 percent of cases identified

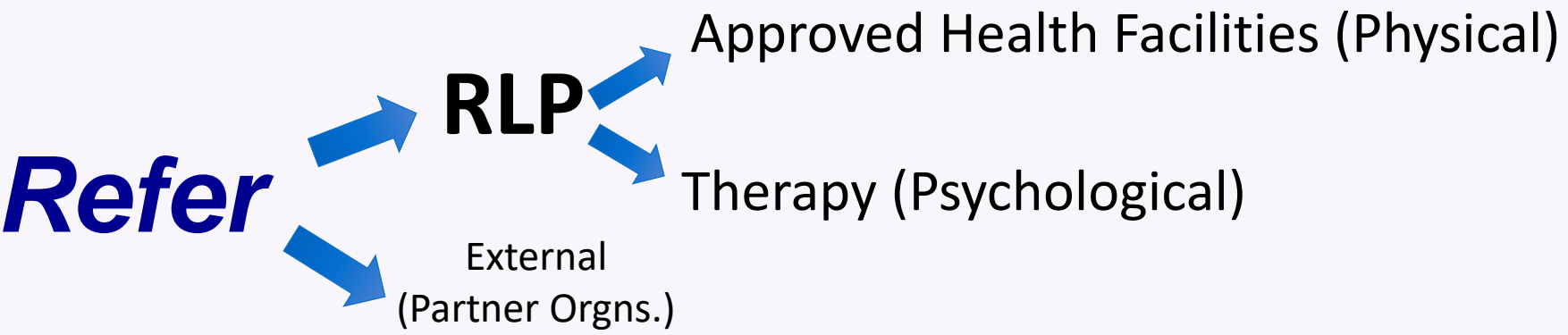

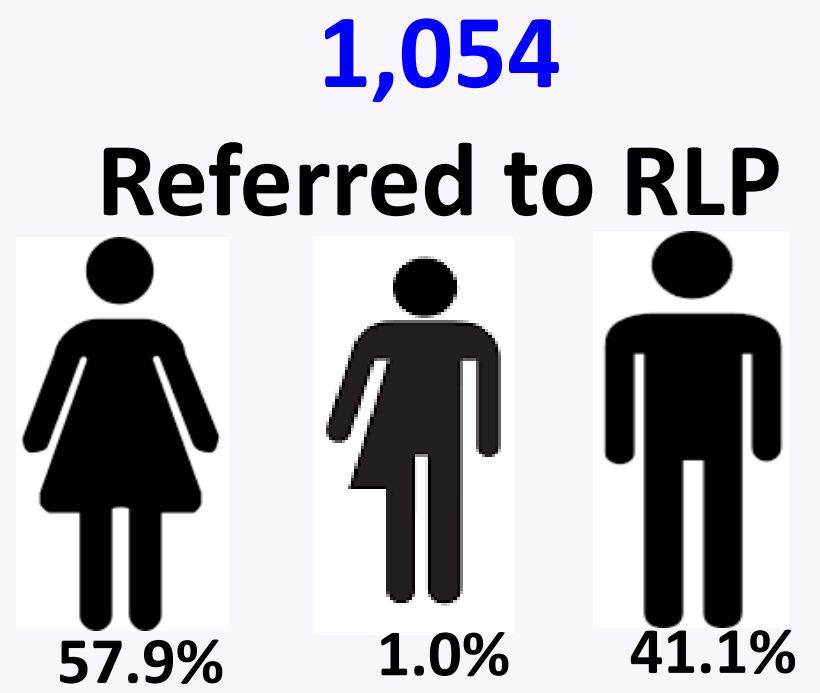

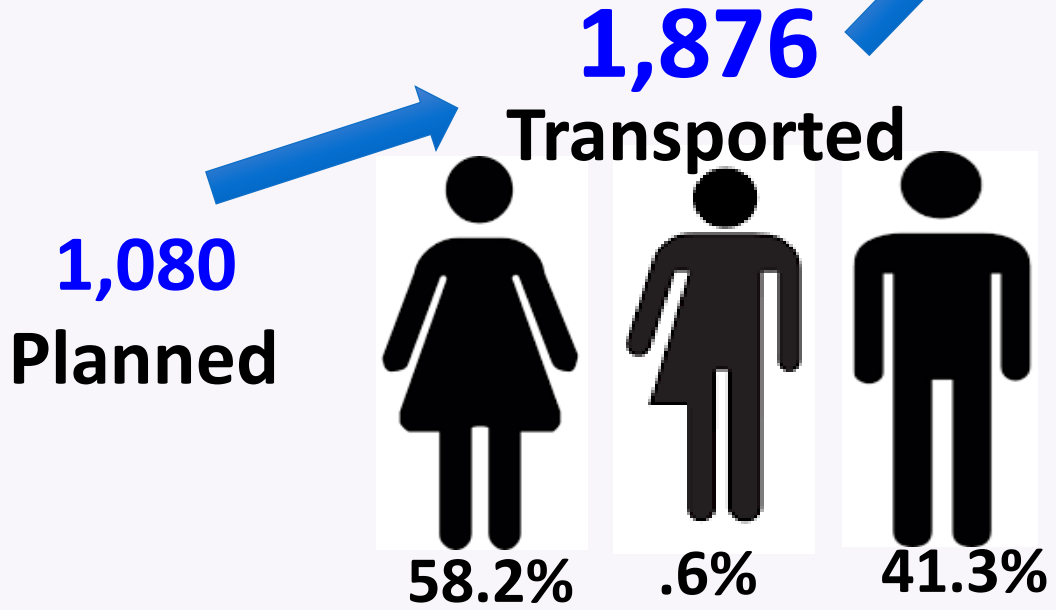

I testify as follows;

- 1) I was born in 1982 in a place called Kirocho found in North Kivu. My parents had eight children and I am the second born. I had four brothers and three sisters. My father was a business man selling cars and my mother was a housewife. Life at home was very good because my father was in position to provide for us all our needs.
- 2) In 1990 I started primary school at school found in Goma and completed in 1996. And then joined still in Goma from 1996 up to 1999 when I fell sick of appendicitis and was bed ridden for three months. After recovering my parents suggested that I stay at home for the whole year and join school again the following year.
- 3) In 2000 I joined Secondary school and I completed in 2008 and was awarded a diploma.

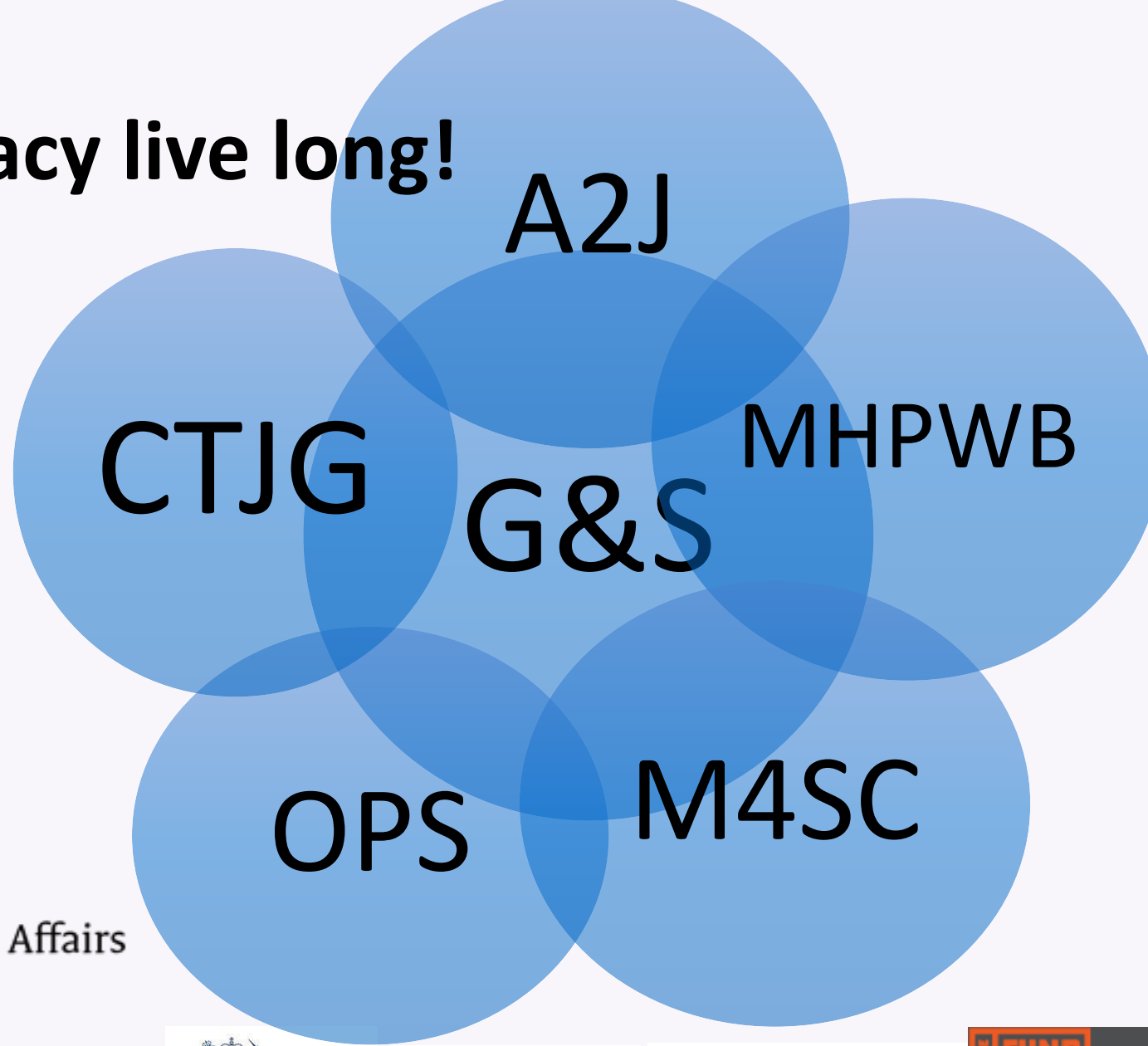
